

Class of 2019 Graduation Survey Results

Surveys were administered at graduation time in May 2019*

Students taking this survey responded to questions about their employment immediately following graduation, utilization of career services, and other questions. 166 students participated in the survey

166 students reported on employment status after graduation (percentages reflect this).

Employed

47.59% (n = 79) employed 35 hours a week or more

9.04% (n = 15) employed less than 35 hours a week

Unemployed

31.93% (n = 53) unemployed and looking for a position

3.61% (n = 6) unemployed and not looking for a position

Attending Graduate School

21.69% (n = 36) enrolled in graduate school full-time

6.63% (n = 11) enrolled in graduate school part-time

Participants did not indicate full-time volunteer or military employment

Relation to major (n = 153)

Students indicated how related their major is to their post-graduation employment or graduate school status (i.e. employed, unemployed, in graduate school)

65.36% (n = 100) indicated that their occupation or graduate school was “very related” or “somewhat related” to their major.

Satisfaction (n = 153)

Students indicated how satisfied they are with their post-graduation status (i.e. employed, unemployed, in graduate school)

45.75% (n = 70) are “very satisfied” with their post-graduation status

30.72% (n = 47) are “somewhat satisfied with their post-graduation status

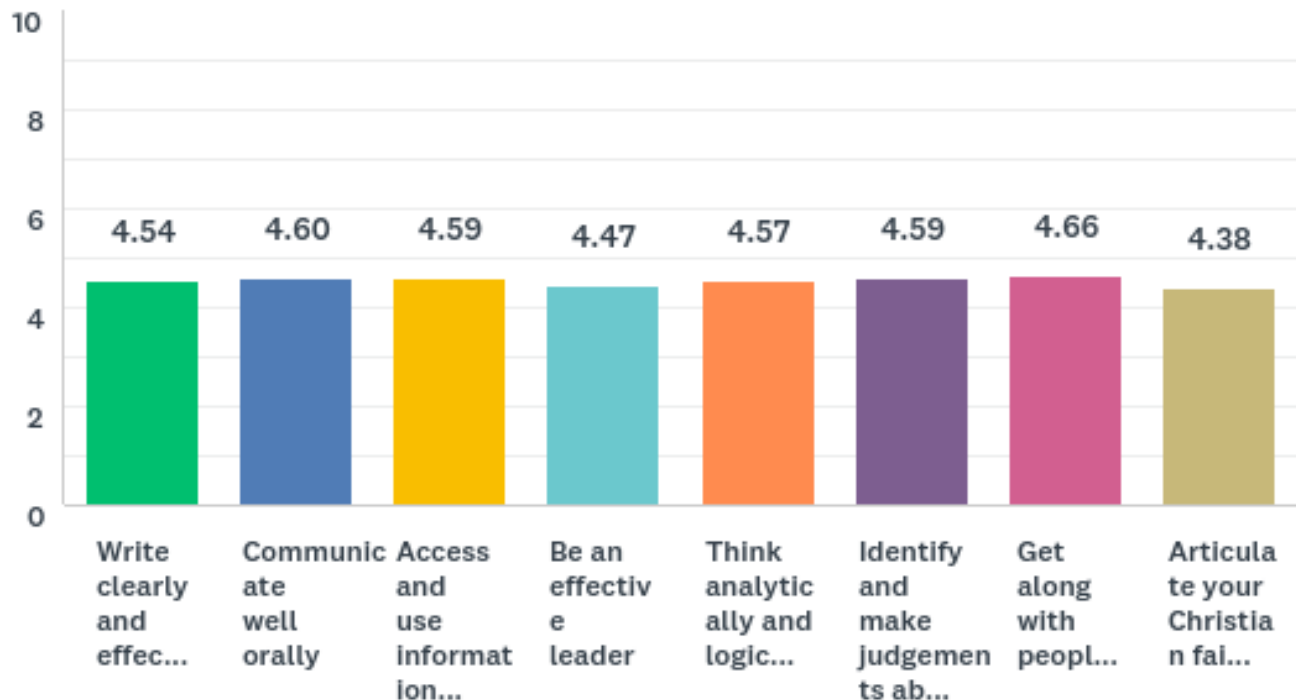

- Write clearly and effectively: **4.54**
- Communicate well orally: **4.60**
- Access and use information effectively: **4.59**
- Be an effective leader: **4.47**
- Think analytically and logically: **4.57**
- Identify and make judgements about moral/ethical issues: **4.59**
- Get along with people of diverse backgrounds and perspectives: **4.66**
- Articulate your Christian faith, serve others, & work for the common good: **4.36**

65.36% (n = 100) indicated that their occupation or graduate school was “very related” or “somewhat related” to their major.
